Pronouns

Pronouns are words that you use to replace nouns.

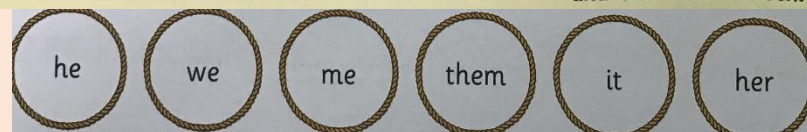
The boy found the ball, and he kicked it.

The pronouns help you avoid repeating 'the boy' and 'the ball'.

They can make your writing flow better and make it easier to understand.

That's Jen's brother. He's older than her.

'He' refers to Jen's brother and 'her' refers to Jen.
