To use brackets, dashes and commas for parenthesis.

- Parenthesis is added information to a sentence, separated by brackets, dashes or commas.
- The sentence still makes sense without the extra bit of information in the parenthesis.
- The extra information in the parenthesis does not make sense on its own.
- Brackets and dashes must always come as a pair. Commas can be a pair or individual.
