English

To use brackets, dashes and commas for parenthesis.

Parenthesis is added information to a sentence, separated by **brackets, dashes or commas**.

The sentence still makes sense without the extra bit of information in the **parenthesis**.

The extra information in the **parenthesis** does not make sense on its own.

Brackets and dashes must always come as a pair. **Commas** can be a pair or individual.

Uncle Nigel (**my dad's older brother**) works on a farm.

Alex's cat – **the one with the stripy tail** – eats biscuits.

I'm going with my two sisters, **Becky and Charlotte**.

Rolling Penalties Home Physical Education

How to play:

- With a partner, set up a goal using two markers.
- Player 1 starts 5 steps away from the goal. Player 2 starts in goal.
- Player 1 rolls the ball towards goal trying to roll the ball past player 2.

- Players score a point each time they score a goal. The first to score 5 points is the winner.
