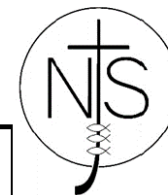




Home Study Learning.

You have two choices for today's activity, see below!

Science Investigation!

- Ask your parents to help find a suitable place to complete this investigation
- You will need a towel, your rocks from yesterday, a plate, a timer (or you can just count), cup of water and a teaspoon, pen and paper to record your results
- Lay a towel out and place your rocks on it.
- Get 1 rock at a time, put it on the plate. Spoon a 1 teaspoon of water on the rock. Time how long it takes for all the water to soak in to the rock.
- Record this on your paper. For example Rock A - 10 seconds.
- Repeat with all your rocks
- Keep your results safe for tomorrow!

Using the rocks you drew yesterday order them from least to most using these properties:

- Smoothness
- Size
- Hardness
- Colour - light to dark?
- Can you think of any other ways to order your rocks?
