


Henri Matisse 1869 - 1954





Henri Matisse was born in France, and was the oldest son of a prosperous grain merchant. He initially studied law, and worked as a court administrator. In 1889, he developed appendicitis. While he was recovering, his mother brought him some art supplies and he began painting. His father was very disappointed when Henri decided to become an artist.

At first, Matisse painted in a traditional style. In 1896, he visited Australia, where he was introduced to Impressionism, and to the work of Van Gogh. Matisse changed his style completely.





In 1941, Matisse had serious surgery and began using a wheelchair. At this time, he began creating large paper collages, with some help from assistants. He called his technique "painting with scissors". In 1952, he established a museum dedicated to his work, the Matisse Museum in Le Cateau. He died in 1954.
