Home Learning: To calculate the mode and range average.


This week you will start looking at averages. This includes the mean, mode, median and range. Today you will look at the mode and range. Below is a simple explanation on how to find them.

Range

The range is the difference between the lowest and the highest value.

Find the highest and lowest values

Subtract the lowest value from the highest



The range is




Mode

The mode is the most frequent value

Count how many of each value appears

The mode is the value that appears the most

You can have more than one mode
