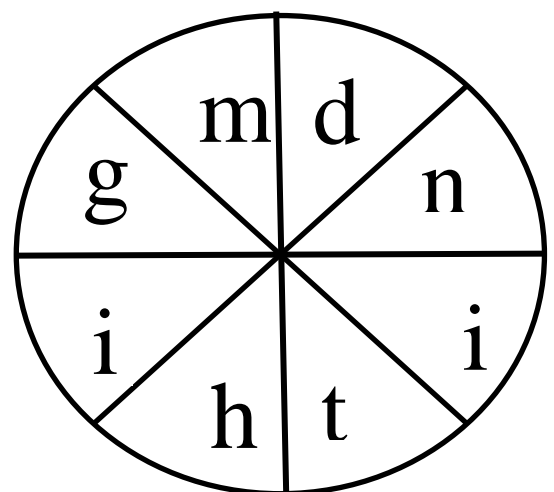

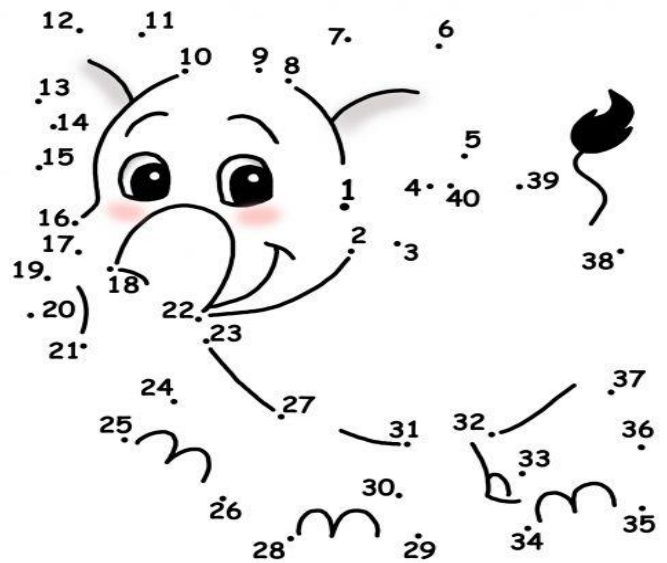

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Cooking

Let's get cooking

Chocolate Chip Cookies

Makes 30

Ingredients: -

110g of butter
110g of light muscovado sugar
1 vanilla pod, seeds only
1 medium egg, lightly beaten
75g plain flour
110g of chocolate chips

Pre-heat the oven to 180°C/350°C/Gas mark 4. Line two baking trays with baking parchment.

Place the butter and sugar in a mixing bowl and beat together with an electric hand whisk until light and fluffy.

Split the vanilla pod lengthways. Using the end of a teaspoon or a small sharp knife, scoop out the seeds. Beat the egg and the vanilla seeds into the mixture, then add the remaining ingredients and stir until thoroughly mixed.

Take spoonfuls of the dough and arrange them on the baking trays, spaced well apart.

Then place them on the shelf just above the center of the oven for ten minutes or until the cookies turn a golden colour and feel firm in the center when lightly pressed.

As soon as the cookies are baked, remove them from the baking sheets using a palette knife. Cool them on a wire rack and, when cold, store in an airtight container.

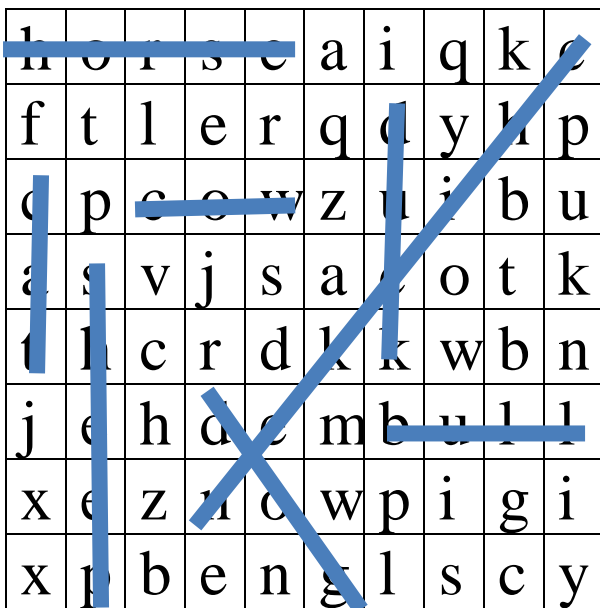

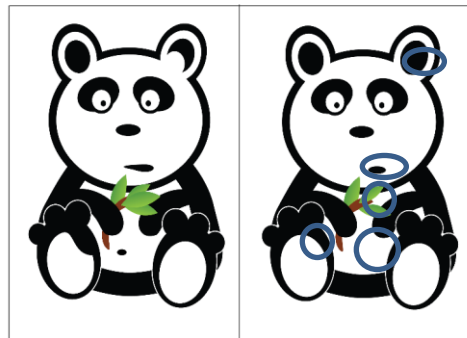


The word wheel was pencil.

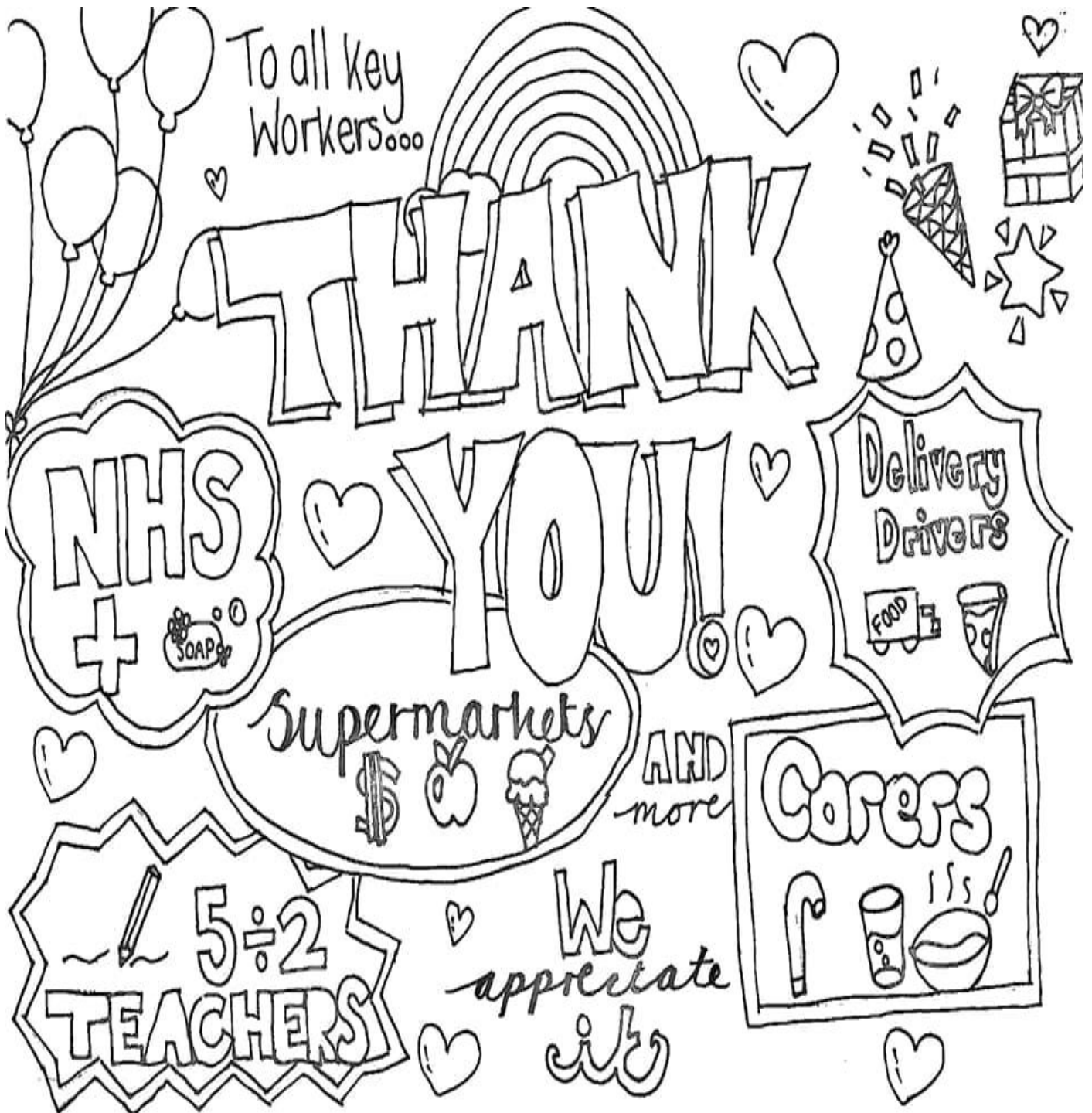

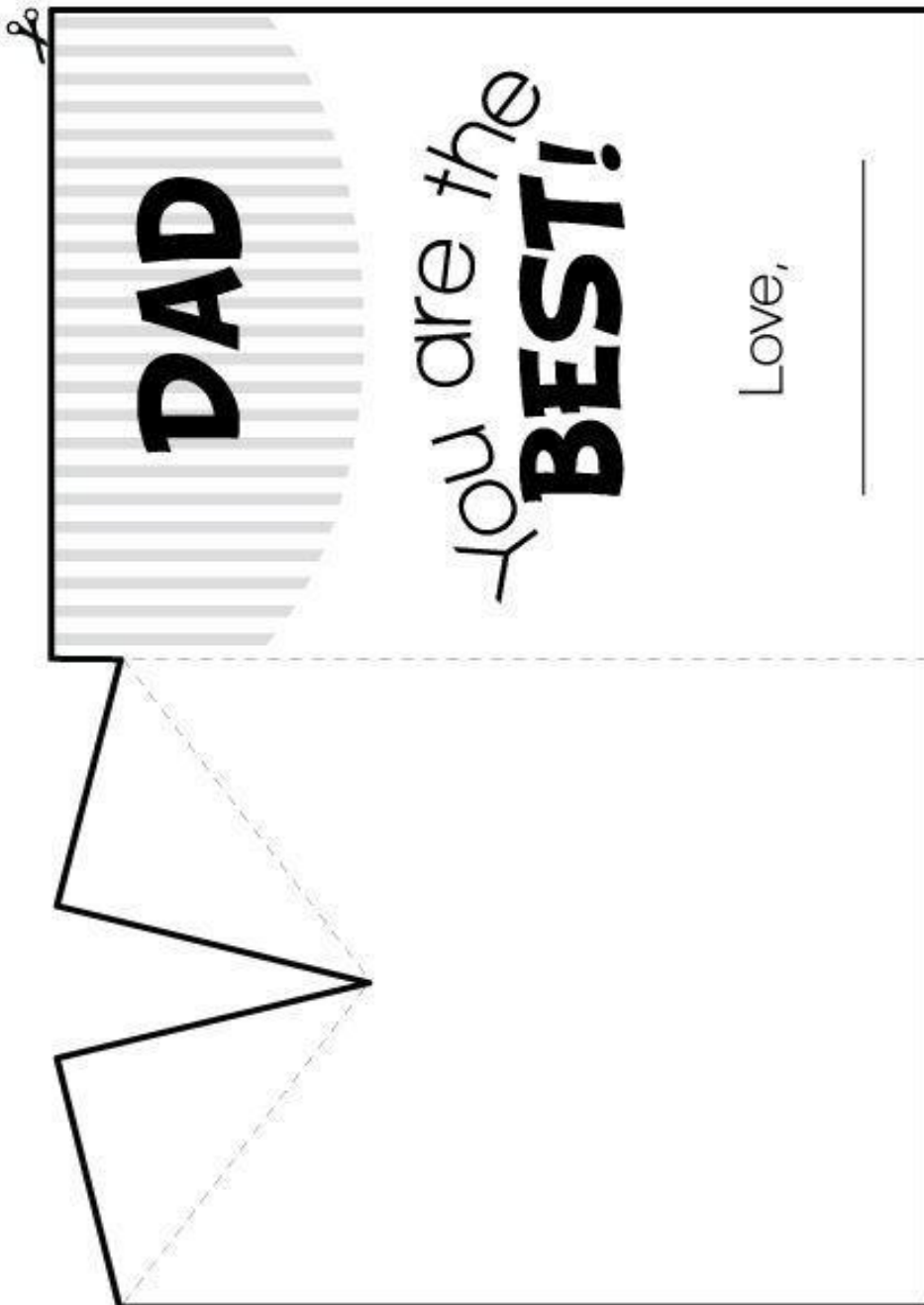
