Mathematical Talk

What is an angle?

L.O: Understanding turns as angles.

Angles are a measurement used to describe a turn. If you complete a whole turn and end up facing the same way you will have rotated 360 degrees. So if you only complete a half turn you will have rotated 180 degrees. In year 5 we need to use this knowledge to understand a range of angles.




