#### **Maths**

Continue looking at the previous sheet based on converting units of measure between metric and imperial.

Take a look at this poster, it helps understand thee conversions between imperial and metric measurements. I really like how they use images to help understand where you might experience each type of measurement.

Can you create a 'help sheet' or 'poster' to show your understanding around the conversions.

You may wish to do further research first.

## Metric → Imperial Imperial → Metric

1 inch = 2.54 cm

To convert inches to cms: multiply by 2.54
To convert cms to inches: divide by 2.54

### 1 gallon = 4½ litres



To convert gallons to litres: multiply by 4.5
To convert litres to gallons: divide by 4.5

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
1 Km = 1/8 mile

To convert Kilometres to miles: To convert miles to Kilometres: multiply by % (0.625) divide by % (0.625)

## 1 litre = 1¾ pints



To convert litres to pints: To convert pints to litres: multiply by 1%(1.75) divide by 1% (1.75)



To convert Kilograms to pounds: To convert pounds to Kilograms: multiply by 2.2 divide by 2.2

# English: Rainforest narrative To plan a story.

- Remind yourself of the storylines in the rainforest stories that you listened to last week. You could look back on your notes about them.
- Yesterday you created your main character for your story. Today you are going to plan what happens to the character. This is their storyline.
- What themes do you want to have in your story? Try to incorporate some:
  - tribes and rainforest people
  - deforestation
  - plants and uses of the rainforest
  - rainforest animals
  - action, excitement, fear, scary parts, learning
- Look at my example on the next slide.

My character is	Ramula. A 10 year old girl from the Nadu tribe in the Amazon.
Who wants	To protect the animals that she has grown up with.
But the problem is	A big company have come to their part of the forest. They are cutting down trees for palm oil and destroying the animals homes. The animals are frightened, hungry and have no trees to live in. Ramula's animal friends' lives are in danger.
So they solve it by	They march to the big company's offices and demand a meeting. Ramula takes her favourite animals and explains the consequences of their actions. They refuse to leave until the company change their ways!
And in the end	The company work with the villagers to sustainably cut down trees - they plant 2 new trees for each one they cut down. As payment for their advice and wisdom, the company open a sanctuary for the animals that were injured or lost their homes.

This is your character from yesterday.

Make sure you don't write the story – you are just planning your ideas!

- 1. Did you enjoy reading the final chapter of Ghost Tower? Did the fast-paced action keep your attention and interest right through to the end of the story?
- 2. Do you think that Leanne would make a good superhero? Explain why you think this. Refer to incidents in the story to back up your ideas.
- 3. What did you think of the first paragraph of chapter 5? Which phrases in this first paragraph do you think were the most dramatic and exciting?
- 4. Who did Leanne think the Shades were reaching for when they appeared on the roof? Who were they reaching for?
- 5. Was the Serpent demon surprised when the Shades began attacking it? How do you know this?
