
BETRAYAL: HOW DID JESUS REACT?

GOSPEL OF LUKE

Betrayal: the breaking or violation of trust, or confidence that produces moral and psychological conflict within a relationship amongst individuals.

Time to think



Now you have a better understanding of the story, <u>think</u> about the following questions (you don't need to write anything down, although you can if you want, just as you would in your Spiritual Scrapbooks)

- 1. Why did Peter deny knowing or being associated with Jesus?
- 2. What word might you use to describe Peter and his actions?
- 3. What was the significance of the rooster crowing?
- 4. How could Jesus love someone who had betrayed him?
- 5. How do you think Peter felt knowing he had been part of the reason Jesus had been led to his death?

Time to work

In your HL books draw 5 post it notes (in class you would've been given post it notes to stick into your books, if you have some at home you could use them) and on each one fill it with your thoughts on the following points.

- 1. What kind of man Peter was.
- 2. Try to defend Peter: why might he have reacted the way he did.
- 3. What kind of man is able to forgive and love someone who has betrayed their trust and loyalty?
- 4. Was it right for Jesus to expect Peter to be truthful when it might have led to Peter being crucified as well?
- 5. What lesson can YOU take away from this that might help you be a better person?
