Today you are going to write your New Year poem.

Start your first draft of your poem on a double page.

The left page will be your first, rough draft.

As you create the poem, I expect you to be crossing out, drawing arrows to show bits moved around, and making notes all around the edge with words and phrases that you want to use.

When you have finished the rough, scribbly version, write the finished, neat version on the right hand page.

Your task

Begin writing your first draft of your poem. When you are happy with your first, messy, edited, scribbled-over draft, you can write up the neat version of it.

Do you want you poem to rhyme? If so, make notes around the edge as you think of rhyming words!

(It would also help to write our the alphabet.)

Remember to write your poem down the <u>centre of the page</u> so that it looks like a poem, and leave a line between verses.

You can illustrate your finished version (draw a picture.)

- 1* support: You may wish to use a computer or tablet to type your poem.
- 3* challenge: Aim to use all types of figurative language in your poem.
