What is an apostrophe?

- A apostrophe is a punctuation mark.
- We see them in lots of words.
- It looks like this... (a bit like a floating comma!)
- There are <u>2</u> uses for them.

Use 1: Missing letters

- Apostrophes can be used in a word to show missing letters.
- We call this a contraction.
- The apostrophe goes where the letters are missing.

do not \rightarrow do not \rightarrow don't

 The <u>o</u> is missed out so that is where the apostrophe goes. Remember it needs a space of it's own!

Use 1: Missing letters

haven't

- Have a go at changing these:

Use 2: Belonging

- Apostrophes can be used to show when something belongs to someone or something.
- We call this **possession**.
- The apostrophe goes in the person or thing, not the item.

Mrs Moody's bag

 The bag belongs to Mrs Moody so the apostrophe goes in Mrs Moody. Remember it needs a space of it's own!
