£1 World Book Day Vouchers will be sent out during the week. You could spend them on these special books released to coincide with World Book Day. Available from all bookshops.

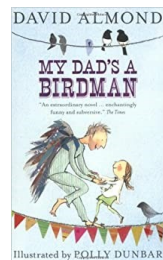


Here are two books I would highly recommend as great stories! For all of you that enjoyed The Big Garden Bird Watch...

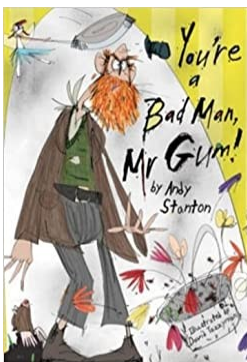
Maybe you could find that story and read it too!! You could read it together.

Reading for Pleasure with your teacher is a really important part of your day. This is what each teacher is reading to their children at the moment. Which book would you like to read?

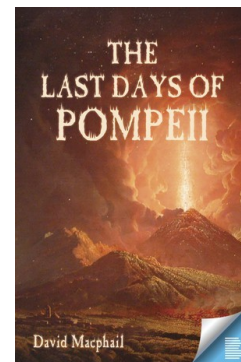
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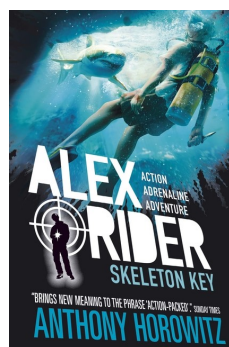
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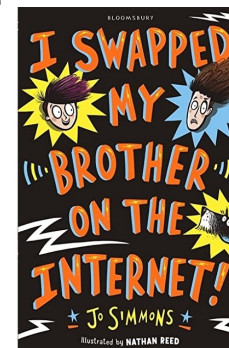
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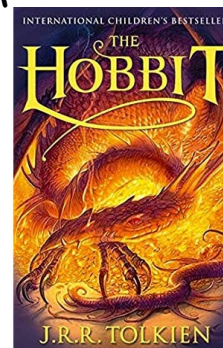
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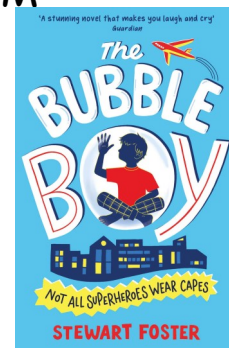
