

Year 4 Homework: Summer 2nd Half Term Issued on: Friday 17th June 2022, Due in: Monday 18th July 2022

Maths

Throughout this half term, the Year 4 Maths curriculum has a strong focus on place value and the four main operations. There are a wide range of topics targeted such as;

- Place Value order and compare numbers beyond 1000
- There will also be a focus on fractions. We will look at non-unit fractions, adding and subtracting fractions with the same denominator. Recognising and showing fractions using diagrams
- Recognise and write decimal equivalents, round decimals with one decimal place to the nearest whole number
- The four main operations for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division: Addition column method, Subtraction column with exchange, Multiplication including multiplying 3 digit numbers by a I digit number and Division garage/bus stop method.
- Mental calculations for the four main operations. Estimate and use the inverse calculation to check answers
- TIME!! Learn to tell the time converting between 12 and 24 hour clacks. Solve problems involving converting hours to minutes, minutes to seconds etc.
- TTRS; speed times tables, learning them all off by heart!
 Some other activities you could try are:
 - Write a list/take photos/show how you and your family have used
 Maths in everyday life over the half term.

We are also open to any other suggestions that you think are appropriate. We want the children to take ownership over their homework and complete it in a way of their choosing.

Spelling

You could:

- Ask the children to record definitions of the words or write the words within sentences.
- Ask the children to colour code the sounds within the words.



- Complete test challenges.
- Ask the children to create a wordsearch containing all of the words.
- Write the words yourself and ask the children to mark them.

Reading

Read at home at least three times a week. Record this reading in your Reading Diary. Consider trying a range of genres e.g. comics, newspapers, biographies, narrative etc. Reading books and Reading Diaries need to be in school every day. How about writing a book review for your favourite book?

Other

This homework is a family activity, which you can decide on:

1) You don't need to evidence this, but feel free to make a poster or write about how you have kept safe online if you wish.

IInstructions

Blocking and reporting bullies is important. Find out how to block and report people on an app or website that allows chat. Get one or more family members together to help. Don't forget to read the setup before doing the activity together!

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Read aloud, step by step: Sometimes people say and do things online that can hurt others. We need to be kind online and stand up to bullies. And if someone is bullying us, we can stand up for ourselves by blocking and reporting them. Blocking a bully makes it so they can't chat with us anymore, and reporting means telling the site or app about the bullying behavior.

Activity

Read aloud, step by step:

- Let's open a website or app that has chat (Roblox, Fortnite, Minecraft, Animal Jam, musical.y, or a social media app). If I don't use these, my family member can open a social media app they use.
- Each site or app is a bit different, but usually tapping on the the other person's picture or profile
 is the first step. Let's try it.
- Let's find the choices about blocking and reporting the other person.
- How can we turn off chat or have a private account? It's always best to only chat with people you know face-to-face.
- If we get stuck, we can use the Help section or search online for how to block and report on that site or app.
- 2) Can you create a poster based on your memories from your year in Year 4? Make this is creative, colourful, and fun as you see fit.
