To learn the spellings your child could:	
 Ask the children to record definitions of the work 	ds or write the words within sentences.
Ask the children to colour code the sounds within the words.	
 Ask the children to create a word search containing all of the words. 	
ABC Order: Write all of your spelling words in alphabetical (ABC) order.	
• Word Parts: Write your words. Then use a coloured pencil to divide the words into syllables. e.g. jump	
ing cat er pill ar	
 Other Handed: Write each word 5 times, switching the hand you write it with each time. Say the word as 	
you spell it.	
 Vowel Spotlight: Write your words using one colour for the vowels and another colour for the 	
consonants (vowels: a, e, i, o, u)	
 Use Technology: Type out your spelling words on the computer. Try to use at least 4 different fonts.
