

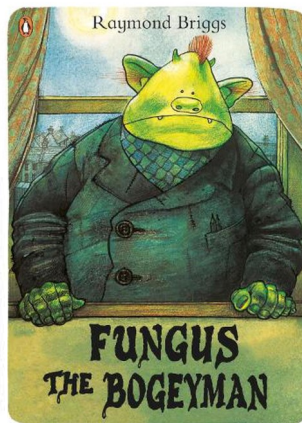
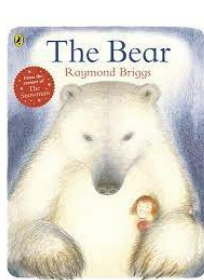
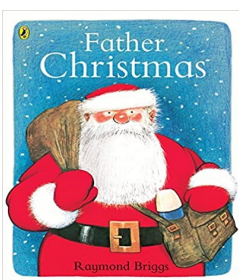
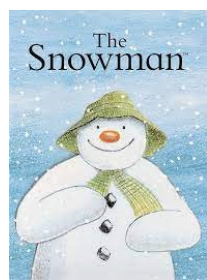


Reading Newsletter

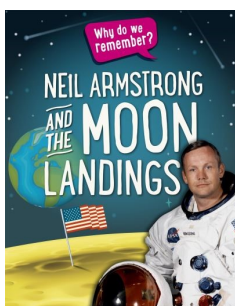

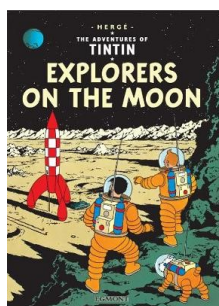

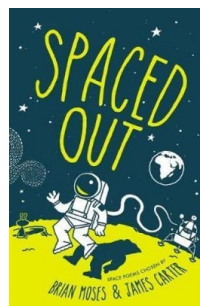
The Man on the Moon by Simon Bartram. Full of Wonderful illustrations bring the story of Bob the astronaut alive! A fun book for all ages.



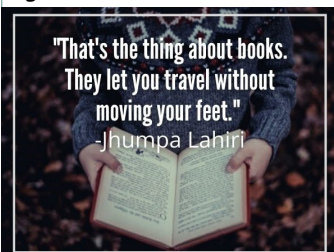
The amazing story of man first walking on the moon! **Neil Armstrong and the Moon Landings by Izzy Howell.** This book is 'one giant leap for mankind.'

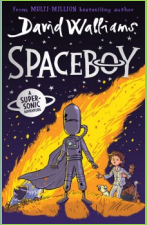
If you only keep one book, which one would it be?

Two New Releases!

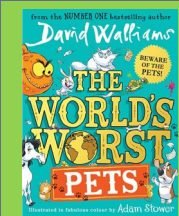

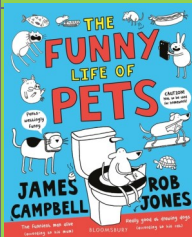

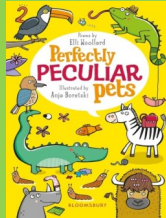


You know what to expect from a World Worst book by David Walliams! Bad bunnies, cruel cats and Zoom the supersonic tortoise!

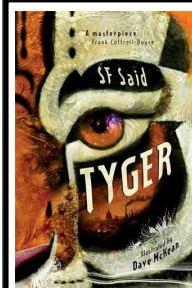
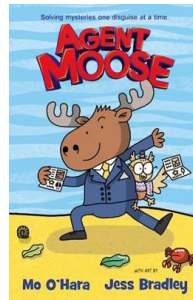
LD Lapinski wrote her first book aged just seven about a frog who owed an aeroplane. She lives by Sherwood Forest and has a cat called Hector.
