




Reading Newsletter Christmas Special.



Set the mood for Christmas and the festive season by diving into the fun of winter, Puzzles, crafts and Winter activities.




A collection of stories -The Very Merry Murder Club as they lead you on a snowcovered wintery journey of Christmassy crimes, festive foul play and murderously

I HIGHLY recommend to anyone in Year 4 and up!

What was the best book you ever had as a gift?

Danger Gang. I received this as a Christmas present a couple of years ago from Mrs Yates and I have shared this with each of my classes since. The classes have always been engaged in the text, especially since such FREAKY things happen in the story... also happen to us in the class!

Who is your favourite book character and why?

My favourite book character is Tóm Bombadil from Lord of the Rings. The description of 'the white chalky path turned into a little river of milk and go bubbling away down into the valley has always stuck with me!

What book would you like Santa to get for you this year? I have ordered 'Allies'. Allies is a work of historical fiction that takes place during World War II. The story pieces together the perspectives of several characters: a young soldier, a paratrooper, a spy and others—to tell the story of the D-Day invasion. The characters come



from different parts of the world, but they all play an important role in the invasion and must try their best to succeed. The characters are extremely realistic, and readers will see themselves reflected in them


Llama on Ice by Annabelle Sami.




The Christmasaurus Cracker by Tom Fletcher

A fun filled collection of puzzles, games, festive activities and stories.




