Maths	
<p>Throughout this half term, the year 5 maths curriculum has a strong focus on place value and the four main operations. We want the children to take ownership over their homework and complete it in a way of their choosing. Handwriting and Spellings.	
<p>All the spellings are taken from Yr5 Key Spelling Document and the children are expected to use the spellings as handwriting practice. Spelling/Handwriting will be sent home with the children weekly, and they will be able to add these into their homework books.</p>	
<p>To learn the spellings your child could:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ask the children to record definitions of the words or write the words within sentences.</li> <li>• Ask the children to colour code the sounds within the words.</li> <li>• Ask the children to create a word search containing all of the words.</li> <li>• ABC Order: Write all of your spelling words in alphabetical (ABC) order.</li> <li>• Word Parts: Write your words. Then use a coloured pencil to divide the words into syllables. e.g. jump ing cat er pill ar</li> <li>• Other Handed: Write each word 5 times, switching the hand you write it with each time. Say the word as you spell it.</li> <li>• Vowel Spotlight: Write your words using one colour for the vowels and another colour for the consonants (vowels: a, e, i, o, u)</li> <li>• Use Technology: Type out your spelling words on the computer. Try to use at least 4 different fonts.</li> </ul>	
Reading	Other Additional
<p>Read at home at least three times a week. Record this reading in your Reading Diary. Consider trying a range of genres e.g. comics, newspapers, biographies, narrative etc. <b>Your reading diary will be marked weekly, so please keep this up to date!</b></p>	<p>This <b>TERM</b> we would like the children to complete work related to our Geography topic "Eastern Europe."</p> <p>We would like the children create a guide, a leaflet, a nonfiction booklet focusing on countries within Eastern Europe.</p> <p>For history the children are learning about Vikings. They can create posters and PowerPoints about the Vikings.</p> <p>This can be completed in their homework book, as a poster or using ICT.</p> <p>This is for the term – so there is no great rush to get it completed.</p>
PE/Swimming	
<p>Please remember that this half term we are <u>NOT SWIMMING</u>. <b>We would advise they bring their PE kits for the week, leaving it in their lockers and taking home on a Friday. Each class will be doing 2x one hour sessions of PE – with one being inside, therefore children will need outdoor trainers each day.</b></p>
