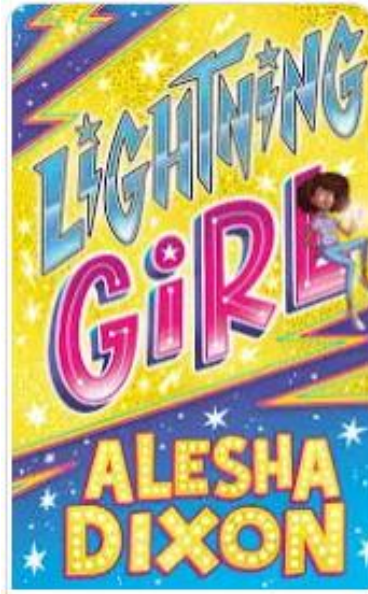


'Lightning Girl' By Alesha Dixon
