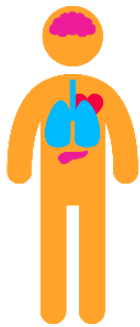


Love your Environment

Air pollution and how you can help

Over the last two months pupils have been learning about air pollution, what causes it and how we can improve the air quality around Newport Junior School.

Pollutants are all around us, in the air we breathe every day. These tiny pollution particles are microscopic - **40 times smaller** than a grain of sand! The more pollution we are exposed to, the bigger the impact on our health.



Air pollution enters the lungs and can affect breathing, making asthma symptoms worse. It can also impact the heart by entering the bloodstream and have a detrimental effect on our mental health and ability to learn.

Clean Air Detectives

Taking place in an air pollution workshop, pupils had an exciting task! They became **Clean Air Detectives!** They looked at the suspects behind air pollution and had to decide whether they thought they were guilty or not guilty for causing air pollution.

They then designed posters to raise awareness of air pollution and how we can reduce it!



Did you know:

Leaving your car engine running for just 1 minute, produces enough air pollution to fill 150 balloons!

Park Smart Promise

Could you help make the roads around Newport Junior School safer?

We understand that some families may have to travel to school by car. If you do need to drive, YOU can make a difference by **parking smartly**.

This includes:

- Parking away from the school entrance preferably using one of the designated Park & Stride locations.
- Respecting speed limits and driving in a legal and considerate manner
- Not blocking dropped kerbs and driveways and not parking on footpaths. By parking on a footpath you restrict space for pedestrians and disabled people often forcing them into the road.
- Do not park on the road outside of the school gates. This includes Keep Clear zig zags, double yellow lines and single yellow lines.

Newport Juniors is keen to promote safety for all pupils and is asking parents/carers to sign the '**PARK SMART PROMISE**' and make a commitment to making all of our school journeys safer.
