Spelling / Handwriting

We will post a small list of year 3 and 4 words to the website each week for the children to practise at home. There will not be weekly tests. The children will use the words in their English lessons. Children can combine learning these with practising their handwriting. They could:

- Write definitions of the words
- Write sentences using the words
- Write the words, using a different colour for each sound
- Draw round the shape of each words, or draw pictures for each word
- Create a wordsearch containing the words
- Practise tests at home

Reading

Children should read aloud at home to an adult at least three times a week. Children should record this reading in their reading diary.

Consider trying a range of genres e.g. comics, newspapers, biographies, narrative etc.

Children will have a year 4 level book and a free choice library book. They may also bring a book in from home. Their year 4 level book and reading diary needs to be in school every day.
