Here is a book I would recommend as a great book to read. The Wanderdays: Journey to


> Fantome Island by Clare Povey A heart pounding, edge-of-yourseat adventure with an important eco message at its

Bird, Bee & Bug Houses by Derek Jones. Contains many fun projects to make the best of your outside space and learn about the wildlife around you.




The Wild Outside by Rachel Ip. A great book to engage younger readers in the flowers and trees in the garden. Beautiful illustrated and full of fun facts.


Miss Lockwood's Summer reading recommendation!







