During Assembly on Wednesday 5^{th} March our junior librarians will be recommending good reads which can be found in our school library.

Mrs Breen will be organising fun book related activities for the children when they visit the library during the week. There will be a Guess the Book Cover Competition

Children will get chance to parade on the big playground to parents at the beginning of the morning-further details to come.
