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On Monday 7th July children should arrive at school as usual at their current gate. They will spend a short time with their current class teacher before going to their new class group where they will spend the rest of the day.

At the end of the day we ask that you collect your child from the gate that they will use in September:

September Year 3, 4 and 6: from the main playground through the black gates closest to Avenue Road South.

September Year 5: through the security gate at the front of school.

Class groups will all be mixed up. Your child was asked to choose friends that they would like to be in a class with in September and we will work hard to try to ensure they are with one of their choices.

We hope that parents/carers understand it is 'tricky' allocating children to class groups and we have worked with every intention to ensure the children will be happy and able to reach their potential.

Please talk to your children positively about change: about the new opportunities it brings with new learning opportunities, new teachers to get to know and new friendships to build. We also ask that you reassure your child that it is normal to have mixed feelings about change (a mixture of nerves and excitement) and that everyone (teachers too!) will share these feelings. If you do feel your child is finding it particularly difficult and you would like further support then please do contact a member of the team.
