



Year 3 Spellings and Homework: Summer 2026 Whole Term

Date issued: on or around 16/4/26

Date to be completed: no later than 26/6/26

Maths – complete regularly

Revisit the column method for 4 operations and practice tables 2x up to 10x and learn number bonds to 20.

Throughout the year we have taught how to apply the 4 operations into a column method.

In year 3 we focus on adding and subtracting 2 and 3-digit numbers, as well as multiplying and dividing 2 digits by 1, including exchange and carrying across place values. See our calculation policy for details of methods, available on the school website.

Revisit these methods with a range of questions. Can't think of any? Jump on google and search:

'2 x 1 multiplication' or 'year 3 column method' 'free worksheet generator year 3'

Alternatively, use a dice to create your questions as children have done many times in class.

Weekly spellings – complete weekly

Children will be given weekly spellings to practice, based on the Year 3/4 statutory spelling list. These will be a focus during literacy lessons. To help your child learn these, you could:

- Ask the children to record definitions of the words or write the words within sentences.
- Ask the children to colour code the sounds within the words.
- Complete test challenges – **try to use the handwriting style shown separately – see sheet stuck in homework book.**
- Ask the children to create a wordsearch containing all the words. Use the Spelling Menu ideas sheet for further inspiration / games.

See the Spelling Menu sheet posted on the year 3 homework page for further ideas. Try to record your spelling practice in your homework book.

Reading – hand in weekly Wed/Thurs

1. As before, children need to read at home preferably **every** day.
2. They need to show evidence of reading at home with an adult **at least three times a week.**
3. **Reading books and Reading Diaries need to be in school every day.**
4. Children, you should **allow parents to record entries in your Reading Diaries and sign it.**
5. **These will be checked weekly by a member of staff.** At this age, it is important that children are exposed to a wide variety of genres, such as comics, papers, information books and story books. House points will be awarded for each parental entry in the Reading Diary.

Ancient Greeks Project – hand in by 26/6/26

This term, we will be studying Ancient Greeks. We would like you to complete some project work on this subject. You do not need to print off lots of things, and often, your own writing and drawings are much better and showcase your skills more! As the project is for the whole term, we would encourage children to try at least one of these activities during the term, but there is no obligation on your child to do so.

Children should be encouraged to create their own versions of any text they copy, as much as possible. As before, you are not obliged to choose something from *this* list, but what you choose *must* be about the Ancient Greeks. Suggested ideas are:

1* - Draw a poster or create some artwork about any aspect of Ancient Greek people or events.

2** Find out about the Trojans and what they did with a wooden horse(!) and either: -

- create a Newspaper report about it.
- write a story about it (ideally at least a page of A4) and draw a picture of it.
- create a model of the Trojan Horse and what it would have looked like (using cardboard / coloured paper, paint etc.

3*** Create your own Monopoly game about Ancient Greece ('Greekopoly'), or a different game, with the aim of teaching player about Ancient Greek events, wars, people, or Gods. You could create some Top Trumps of Ancient Greek gods, for example.
