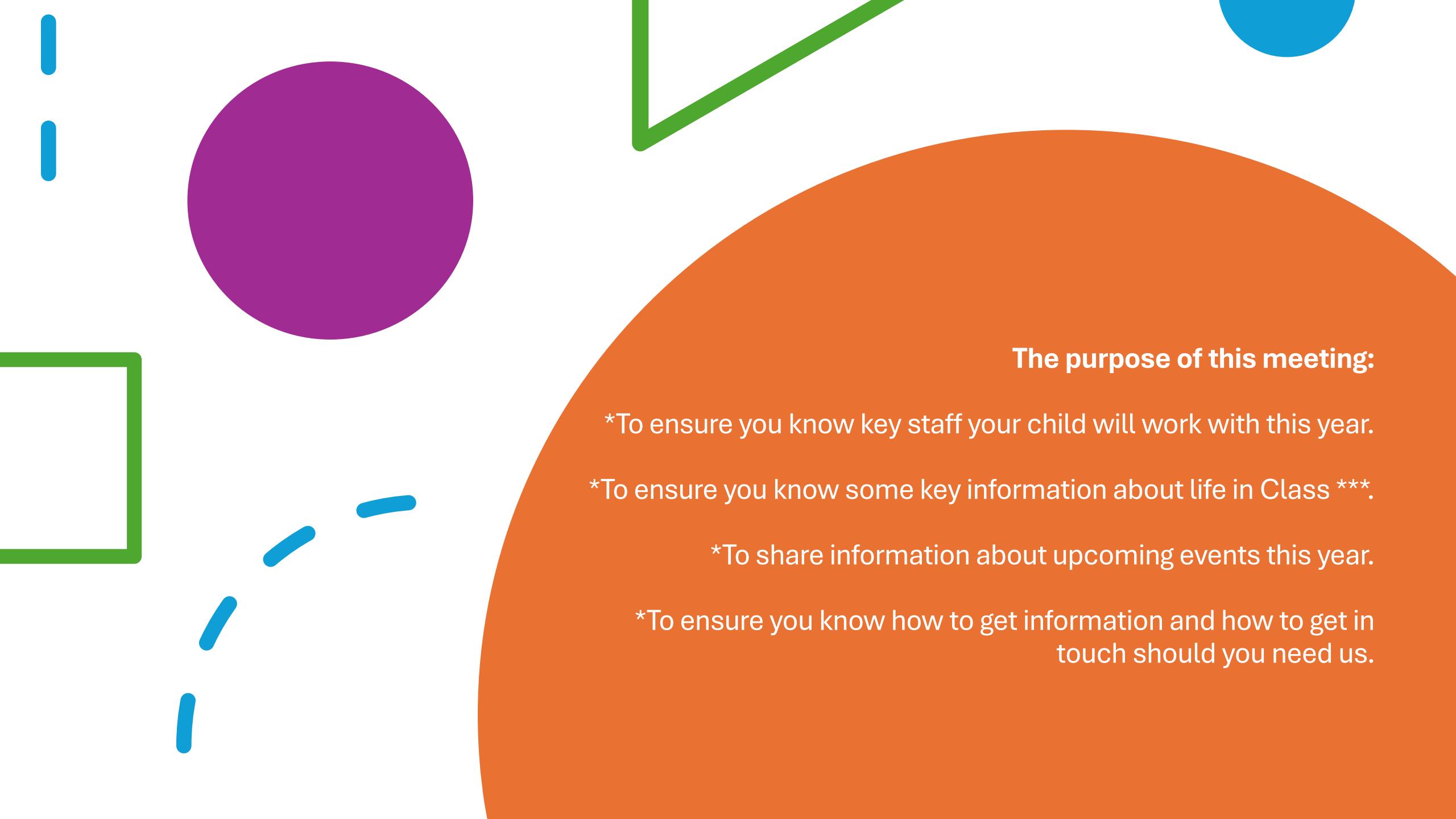


Welcome to Class 5L

- *To ensure you know how to get information and how to get in touch should you need us.



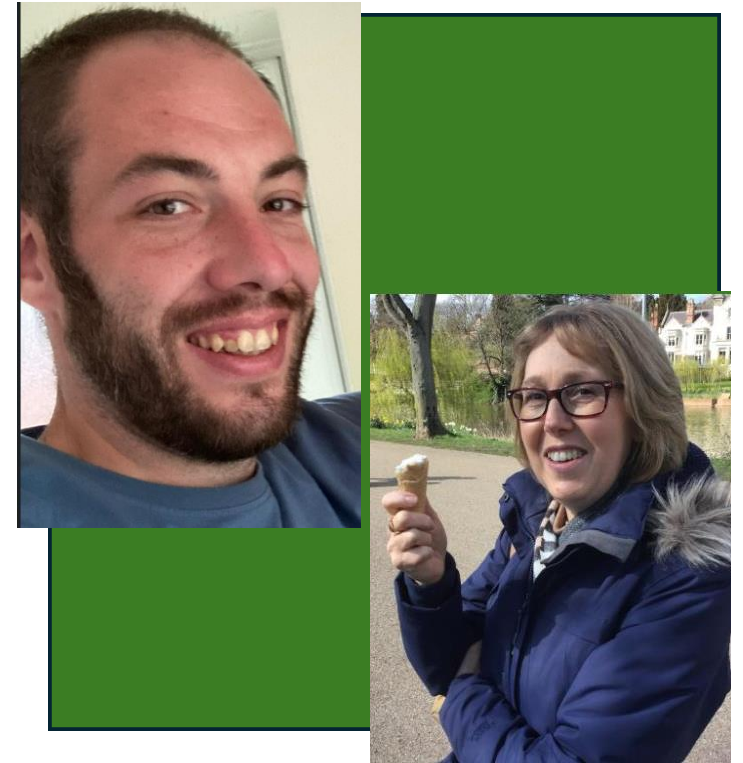

Equipment and kit....

- * Items brought to school need to fit into their locker.
- * Lunchboxes are placed on our lunchbox trolleys when they arrive and need to be collected from them at the end of the day.
- * Filled water bottle in school each day.
- * PE kit in school all week.
- * Pencil case, reading diary, reading book in school each day.
- * Swimming kit: we will be swimming on a Monday.
- * Beech's Base: we will be at Beech's Base on Tuesday 20th October this term. Children need old clothes: long trousers and long sleeves and waterproofs and wellies!
- * Please name EVERYTHING!! Lost property is to the right of the office in a large red bin however anything named will always be returned straight to your child.



Mobile Phones

We ask that ideally mobile phones are NOT brought to school at all.

IF you feel it necessary for your child to bring their phone please know:

- Your child must hand it to their teacher on arrival.
- It will be stored during the day but not necessarily locked away. We are not liable for the phone.
- It will be returned only as they leave school site.

RESIDENTIAL OFFER AT NJS



Aside from the obvious importance of academic lessons, we believe that there are endless possibilities for learning beyond the classroom. Each year we engage the children with a range of inspirational trips or by arranging for special experiences or visitors to come to school. These situations often bring out previously unseen skills, interests or talents in the children. Hands on situations build upon our ethos of equipping the children to discover and explore their own learning style and to be able to realise and work towards tangible goals within their learning journey.

Our residential trips give the children the opportunity to stay away from home for a night or two and builds great independence skills and a feeling of pride in themselves and what they have accomplished. We also try and keep the residentials a good distance apart, which enables the children to develop emotionally and independently as well as allowing parents to budget for the future residentials. Transport: A coach takes children from NJS to Arthog and back at the end of the week.	What they need? Pillowcase and duvet cover, OLD outdoor clothing! Waterproofs and walking boots all provided by Arthog.
What activities are included? Orienteering, raft building, canoeing, surfing, gorge walking, climbing mountain walking.	What food is provided? Children need to bring lunch for the first day and then all meals are provided: cooked breakfast, lunch and tea!	Good to know..... *A meeting will be held for parents in the Spring Term to find out more details about the arrangements and to sign medical forms etc for this visit. *Children sleep in single sex dormitories that range from around 6 to 14 children.
